We will send confirmation of place(s) booked on receipt of your booking.

By the end of March 2018 we will send details of the age group your child is in and an invoice. If the programme is oversubscribed there will be a waiting list – we will tell you when you book if this is the case; this will be kept until early April when we will tell you if there are places.

Yearly Meeting 2018 Children's Programme

For 0 – 11 year olds



Yearly Meeting is a Quaker experience for Friends of all ages from all over Britain.

The Children's Programme will enable 0 – 11 year olds (born between 1.9.06 and 03.5.18) to participate and share in Yearly Meeting in their own ways.

It is an opportunity to be part of making and experiencing a Quaker community.

What is the Children's Programme?

During Yearly Meeting the Children's Programme is available on the Saturday, Sunday and Monday in the mornings and afternoons.

We expect to have two separate groups for 0 to 5 year olds, and two separate groups for 5 -11 year olds. Decisions about these groups will be taken once we know who has booked.

A programme for 5 -11 year olds (born between 1.9.06 and 31.8.12) is also offered during the Swarthmore Lecture on the Saturday evening.

The different age groups will give children age appropriate ways to explore their place in Quakers and the world, make friendships, worship, be creative, have fun and play games.

The Children's Programme is planned to enable children to gain the maximum experience of a national Quaker gathering, building friendships, worshipping together and exploring their spirituality.

Each child, apart from the very youngest, will, in their age groups, be part of a small group that will meet regularly and have an adult team member working with them.

All places need to be booked in advance and bookings are made for all children by session (morning, afternoon, Swarthmore Lecture) for each day.

How to book:

Children participating in the Children's Programme must have a parent or other responsible adult in Friends House during the sessions that they are on the programme.

Places are allocated on a first come, first served basis and may be filled before the deadline. The programme is for those aged 0 to 11 (born between 1.9.06 and 03.5.18) who have a parent or other responsible adult at Yearly Meeting.
