We heard ministry about transformation and Friends continue to write about the life-changing experience of being together in worship, being held in God's transformative love.

FWCC is very grateful for the support yearly meetings gave to Friends who felt ready to travel and engage with other Friends in this important way. It feeds us all. And we appreciate the yearly meeting's continuing work of strengthening the Religious Society of Friends. It happens at all levels!

With a commitment to bringing youth to the World Plenary Meeting, 90 young adult Friends were among us, enriching discussion on topics affecting the future of the Religious Society of Friends and amplifying the Quaker voice in the world. Four consultations were held on developing leadership and ministry; strengthening our worshipping communities; furthering the Kabarak Call for Peace and Eco-Justice and considering how we contribute to a peaceful and sustainable life on Earth; and equipping FWCC.
