# Workshops about working with and including children and young people

Children and young people's work training develops knowledge and understanding of children and young people's work in Quaker meetings.

This helps meetings become more confident and equipped as worshipping communities.

#### What does the training offer?

Each workshop provides opportunities to learn, reflect, practice and plan about aspects of work with children and young people in Quaker meetings.

All children and young people's training opportunities focus on learning and developing in ways that are accessible, friendly, challenging and flexible.

#### What is needed?

Workshops require a suitable venue, a named contact person from the meeting and the guarantee of at least six participants. There is a £5.00 fee per participant payable on the day. A typical workshop runs from 10.30am to 4pm and normally takes place on a weekend.

#### Who delivers the training?

The workshops and visits are facilitated by the children and young people's work trainers from the Quaker Life Network and are supported by the Children and Young People's Work staff team at Friends House.

### How do you request training?

### What happens next?

Once we have received a booking request we will arrange two facilitators for the workshop. If we are unable to arrange facilitators for the dates requested we will ask you for some more dates. When everything is confirmed we will send you leaflets to help you promote the opportunity.
