## Who is Yearly Meeting Gathering for?

Yearly Meeting Gathering (YMG) is primarily for members and attenders of the Religious Society of Friends in Britain. Family members and friends of Quakers attending are also welcome to join our community. Friends

not in membership who wish to join Yearly Meeting in session may do so with the permission of the Yearly Meeting clerk. Further details can be found at www.quaker.org.uk/ym.

## **Access requirements**

We are working hard to make the Gathering an inclusive and accessible event. Most accommodation is close to our community space and the campus is on level ground. Your local or area meeting clerk should be the first port of call for any support or primary care you may need during YMG. During the Gathering members of Britain Yearly Meeting Pastoral Care Group will be

on hand to give additional support. If your area meeting is unable to help, the Pastoral Care Group will try to help, but it needs advance notification. To help us make your Gathering as comfortable as possible, please state your needs clearly when you book. We will do our best to satisfy all requests within the limits of the venue and the event as a whole.



#### How to book

We have simplified the booking process this year so that you can book your place and know immediately what type of accommodation you have been allocated. Bookings and the allocation of accommodation will be managed for us by the University of Warwick. As well as giving you greater certainty at the time of booking, the availability of university staff trained in managing bookings for complicated events allows our staff and volunteers to focus on organising a unique Quaker event.

There will be two significant changes to the way bookings were made previously:

## **Bursaries**

#### **Assistance**

- Full payment must now be made at the time of the booking.
- If you wish to be accommodated with a group, the whole group must be booked and paid for at the same time.

We recognise that some Friends will be used to the old booking arrangements, but the growth of Yearly Meeting Gathering means this is no longer sustainable.

#### **Donations**

If you would like to help other Friends attend the Gathering by making a donation to the Bursary Fund, you will be able to do so when making your booking.



## **Accommodation**

There are four types of accommodation available, each of which has half board and self-catering options. Most accommodation is located close to the buildings we will use for eating and community activities.



#### Single en-suite rooms

Some are in flats of eight bedrooms with a limited number of twin rooms. Some are in corridor style accommodation. We have arranged for one block to be a little further away from the centre of the campus for those Friends who prefer a quieter environment. The walk from this block to the centre will take about 12 minutes.

#### Single semi-en-suite rooms

Corridor style accommodation divided into

pairs. Each pair shares a bathroom and has its own front door.

#### Single standard rooms

Some are in flats of various sizes where approximately four people share a bathroom. Some are in corridor-style accommodation where approximately six people share a bathroom. Please note this type of accommodation has no elevators.

#### **Budget standard rooms**

These are in flats within an older accommodation block. There are 12 rooms per flat with two bathrooms and one shower in each. This accommodation isn't suited to those with mobility difficulties or small children as the flats are built on different levels. There is a big step into the shower





from the bathroom floor and the kitchen and communal space are separated by a step. Both areas are quite small. Also, there is no lift access to the upper floors.

#### Children sharing

Children who were born on or after I September 2006 can sleep on the floor of a parent's or sibling's room. We will provide a camping mat and sleeping bag to those who can't bring their own.

#### Camping and caravans

For those who wish to camp or stay in a caravan, there will be a campsite on campus with a minimum of 30 pitches. Depending on the size of each pitch, this number may increase. Fires or open BBQs are not permitted. Vehicle access is limited by size

and weight, but we anticipate that a regular-sized mobile home or caravan and car will fit. Vehicles will be able to access the site for set-up, then park in nearby car parks. The site will have toilets, showers and a cold water supply. Please check our website for further details as they become available.

## Young Adults at YMG

Young Adults at Yearly Meeting is for 18-25-ish-year-olds attending YMG. This offers a way of being part of the main sessions while maintaining a smaller community to check in with regularly during the week. Young Adults at Yearly Meeting is not a fully facilitated programme, but we will offer regular sessions that give you the chance to prepare for and reflect on your experience of Yearly Meeting. ## Children's and Young People's Programmes

The Children's and Young People's Programmes are a central part of YMG. They encourage the spiritual and personal growth of children and young people in a variety of ways that are age-appropriate, fun and creative. All under-18s will be booked automatically on to the programme sessions that run for the time they are at the Gathering (for the very youngest there will be some flexibility in attending sessions). All under-18s must be accompanied by a responsible adult (e.g. a parent or other family member; for Junior Yearly Meeting someone from the area meeting or Quaker school may be appointed to the role). There may also be some optional evening sessions for 5- to 11-year-olds, which will be offered after bookings have closed.

Everyone attending YMG will be asked to respect the community guidelines, which will be provided prior to the event; those attending the Young People's Programme and Junior Yearly Meeting must agree in advance to the behaviour boundaries for their age group.

**Early booking is recommended.** For both the Children's Programme and the Young People's Programme, a limited number of spaces are set aside for day visitors.



#### Children's Programme

Children will have the chance to worship together, play games and hear stories. They will encounter and explore being a Quaker in ways that are appropriate yet challenging for their age. The children will be divided into five age groups, to be determined after the booking deadline.

#### Young People's Programme

The Young People's Programme enables young people to have fun while exploring their spirituality, experiencing Quaker practices and reflecting on their Quaker lives. This programme is arranged by a group of young people, with the support of adult volunteers and staff.



#### Junior Yearly Meeting (JYM)

JYM is about building relationships and making friends. It is arranged by a group of young people, with the support of adult volunteers and staff. Activities are themed and include worship, visiting speakers, discussions and attending Yearly Meeting sessions. Most of the places at JYM are available for nominees from area meetings, Quaker schools and European yearly meetings. Nominations information will be circulated by the end of November 2016. To find out more, ask your meeting or school who to speak to. You can also book directly via our website if you are not being nominated for a place.
