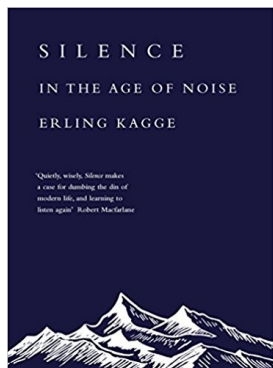

### SILENCE IN THE AGE OF NOISE

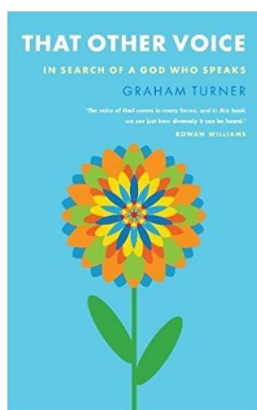
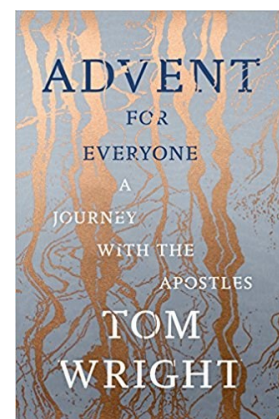
**Erling Kagge £9.99**

**Graham Turner £12.99**

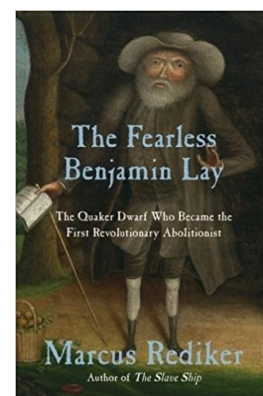

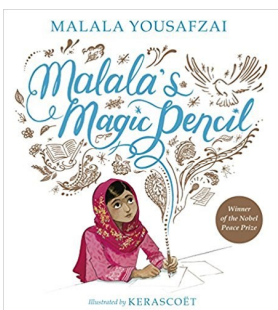
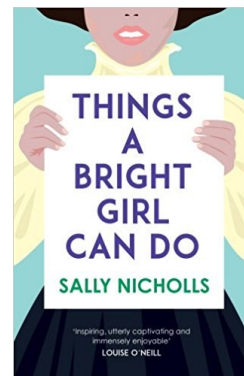


**THE BEYOND WITHIN: a commentary on *Through a Glass Darkly***

Thought-stirring and provocative, this book offers a critique of the strand within Quaker non-theism which advocates a future for Britain Yearly Meeting based on the form of atheism known as 'radical religious humanism'. Affirming that for Quakers transcendence and immanence are indivisible, *The Beyond Within* underlines the importance of that very special attitude to the world we call 'mystical' which is at the heart of the Quaker experience and a necessary element in our worship.
