"A meeting house should not be regarded primarily in terms of bricks and mortar, or merely seen in relation to potential site value. Its real value derives from the worship and service of the meeting. Even so, our meeting houses no less than our own homes deserve our care, attention and imaginative thought, so that they may be attractive both to ourselves and to others whilst remaining faithful to our commitment to simplicity, care of the environment and equality."

Our yearly meeting is the custodian of many historical and contemporary Quaker meeting houses. Quaker property is owned at area meeting level and as such is the responsibility of area meeting trustees. We offer a variety of support, including information on the appropriate use of Quaker property and how to deal with many of the property issues that arise.

Friends Trusts Limited

Friends Trusts Limited holds the legal title to the properties of almost all area meetings in England and Wales. Trustees of these meetings should contact Friends Trusts Limited if they plan to:

- purchase or otherwise acquire property (for example, through gift or bequest);
- sell, transfer, lease or otherwise dispose of property.

If your meeting is planning any such actions, please contact Friends Trusts Limited as early as possible for guidance via the secretary, at friendstrusts@quaker.org.uk or on 020 7663 1082. Area meetings in Scotland are subject to Scottish law, under which they are able to own property in their own name.

Meeting Houses Funds

Where appropriate, funds are available for making loans or grants, or both, to area meetings to meet part of the cost of:

- building new meeting houses;
- the purchase and adaptation of properties to make them suitable for use as meeting houses;
- major alterations to existing meeting houses;
- major repairs to historic meeting houses.

Property Advice cluster

experience in the area but are not necessarily experts: the ultimate decision will rest with the trustees of the area meeting concerned.
