WOMEN

The project is based in Kisumu in Kenya and is supported by Cheltenham local meeting.

The project will support a sustainable farming project run by the Aniga Women's Initiative, growing crops resistant to the changing weather patterns of climate change, and setting up a smallholder marketing co-operative and a demonstration farm.

Local agricultural experts have been commissioned to advise on environmental issues and appropriate crops, helping the women move towards economic independence. In addition to providing an income, the project will also provide regular, nutritious food for the women (many of them widows) and their families. Once the co-operative has been successfully established, the aim is to train and support other communities to introduce the same kind of farming.
