## WOMEN

The project is based in Kisumu in Kenya and is supported by Cheltenham Quaker meeting.

The project is supporting a sustainable farming project run by the Aniga Women's Initiative, which aims to grow crops resistant to the changing weather patterns of climate change, and set up a smallholder marketing co-operative and a demonstration farm.

Following the feasibility study in year one, orange fleshed sweet potatoes were selected for climate resilience. The project will train farmers to grow the crop, and also support families to grow and use the vegetable, with the surplus being sold to supplement incomes. The aim is to involve up to 960 families over three years, reducing infant mortality and malnutrition.
