Further to the discussion of financial strategy at our 2019 AGM, Kate Green has prepared a fundraising leaflet - attached. We have not printed hard copies of this yet due to the Coronavirus outbreak.

We encourage Friends to make donations to QANand also to invite their Meetings to do so. Now that QAN is a Recognised Quaker Body it is fine for Quaker meetings to give us donations. However as we are not a registered charity in our own right (but sit under the BYM's aegis) we are not in a position to reclaim tax on donations. A small regular stream of income would enables us to cover core expenses, such as the website, room bookings and travel expenses where necessary, without anxiety. Our reserves (largely resulting from a large 'legacy' donation from the Leaveners, in 2018) have enabled us to underwrite projects such as the *Seeking Routes* art exhibition, and to experiment with more frequent advertising in *the Friend*.

7. Grant making

We have not so far had any volunteers willing to make up a grant-making committee. If the committee receives requests for grants they are therefore being dealt with on an ad hoc basis, and tested against our agreed aims, with priority given to QAN projects.
